## OPIATE OVERDOSE RESCUE PROCEDURES

If it's reported and/or witnessed that an individual is experiencing an Opiate Overdose, use the following procedures.

Immediately contact one of our in-house Security Officers and contact 911 to respond to the situation. If Security is not available then proceed to:

Stay with the individual, direct a Team Member to retrieve one of the "Opiate Overdose Rescue Kits" (or retrieve it yourself if close by, and safe to do so) located in **Security Control** and each of the following areas:

## IMPORTANT STEPS TO TAKE WHILE WAITING FOR FIRST RESPONDERS

## **Opiate Overdose Rescue (Steps)**

- ✓ Clear the area to allow breathing room and prevent distraction
- ✓ Put on Nitrile Gloves
- ✓ Try to wake up the individual (yell their name, rub knuckles over breastbone)
- ✓ If person is not breathing, give rescue breaths (using CPR barrier mask)
- ✓ Give Naloxone Nasal Spray (located in the Opiate Overdose Rescue Kit)
  - Place tip in nose
  - Spray up one nostril (it takes 2-3 minutes to work)
  - o If the person doesn't respond give another dose in the other nostril
  - Stay with person and keep them breathing
  - Place person on their side in case of vomiting
  - Be mindful, and to avoid injury to the guest and/or team member(s); once revived, the individual may (unintentionally) flail their arms and/or legs in reaction to the Naloxone Nasal Spray.

Once first responders arrive, follow their lead, and provide an update to Security soon after the incident.
